



Google hates affiliates.

You might have heard that before, but guess what?

I'm here to prove that it's completely false.

I've spent over \$6 million on Google Ads in the last five years.

I'm going to show you inside my Google Ads account as an affiliate marketer, and you're going to learn the top 6 reasons why most affiliate marketers fail completely with Google Ads.

And I'm going to show you how to avoid those failures and start earning fast income from affiliate marketing online.

So let's go inside my computer and let's describe what's happening and why people think Google doesn't like affiliate marketers.

OK, here we are inside my Google Ads account.

And as you can see, I've been running consistent traffic for almost 7 years now on Google Ads.

And this is all for affiliate marketing campaigns.

Over \$6 million and spend roughly \$1,000,000 a year and over 202,000 conversions on Google Ads.

Now let's talk about why most affiliates think that Google doesn't work or that they lose their accounts quickly.

The reason why a lot of people lose their accounts or they fail is the number one problem which is the destination requirements.

You see, Google wants people to have a good user experience when they search and whether they click on an ad or whether they click on an organic result they want, Google wants the visitor to be happy when they arrive on the end page.

And so just like organic traffic, we need to optimize our pages for ads as well.

So there are rules and specific policies you must follow as an affiliate marketer and your destination experience must follow every single one of these rules to a tee.

And the biggest one that we have a challenge with is this one called the bridge page doorway gateway policy, where we are not allowed to link to other pages.

If we just build a page that is only catered to make people click through to another page.

Now you would think, hey Joey, that's what affiliate marketing is.

We build landing pages.

We want people to come to our landing page and then click through to the affiliate offer.

That's the purpose of our landing page.

But there are ways that you can design your website and design your landing pages so that you offer value to the end user.

And that is key here and it is what makes the difference between losing your account or spending \$6 million over the next five years.

The key here is make sure you're building high quality websites and high quality content.

It's the the first link you're going to see it is called the 30 day challenge and it is our Google ads course that we just launched and it talks about everything I'm about to share with you in depth and it shows you a live example of what is happening here and how we're able to comply with the Google ads policy.

OK, so the second reason why most people fail with Google Ads, especially affiliates, is they set up redirects and they end up losing their account for what is called circumventing systems.

You might have heard of this policy before circumventing systems and as soon as Google sees certain redirects happening, or maybe your payment method was not correct or maybe you're using a prepaid credit card, All of these things can result in what is called a

circumventing systems ban.

And that is one of the worst bans you can have as an affiliate marketer because usually they don't go back on that policy.

So be sure when you're setting up your Google Ads account that you are not using a VPN.

You're going in, you're the real person, you're using your own e-mail address, you're using a credit card that's in your name, a real credit card.

You set that up.

And when you're setting up your first campaign, do not use an affiliate tracker that does not work with parallel tracking.

And what I mean by that is that you do not want to use redirects from your ad to your landing page.

You want to go directly to your landing page and track the direct traffic.

I use CPV Lab Pro for that.

That is the tracking system I use.

They have a system that allows me to track my Google Ads campaign without using redirects and I get to keep all the data and I'm not giving that data to a third party.

That is what I like about CPV Lab Pro.

The next big thing that people do wrong once they actually get into Google Ads and they're running campaigns is they auto apply recommendations or they listen to the advice of their Google Ads Rep.

I'm sorry if you're an ad Rep out there and you're watching this, but most of the time these auto recommendations are built to make you spend more money.

When you implement them on an already running campaign that has a ton of data, you'll find that your campaign does a whole bunch of weird things and you start spending a whole bunch more money.

So be careful on applying the recommendations.

When you come into your Google Ads account, you'll see over here on the left

recommendations and you'll see a whole bunch of recommendations on how to better improve your campaign.

Now there are some good recommendations in there.

Sometimes they'll offer you new keywords that you can start running or they'll tell you about some ad ideas that you can implement.

But for the most part, do not auto apply the recommendations.

Do a good thorough analysis on what they're recommending and how much more it's going to cost you.

We describe that in detail in the course that I just mentioned #4 most affiliates fail at sending conversions back into Google Ads.

This is a big one.

Google Ads has automated bidding.

They have automatic, automatic strategies on how to get your ads in front of the right people that are converting.

If you are not giving conversion data back to Google ads, you will fail eventually.

Because what happens is as more conversions happen, Google can see who's searching for what, what position you're in, what country you're in, what time of day.

These conversions happen and they start to show your ads at the right time in the right locations to the right people.

So be sure that you're sending conversion data back.

And for that I use CPV Lab Pro again for for sending the conversion data back through uploads and stuff like that.

It's all described on the CPV Lab support site and how to do this.

And I can't stress how important it is to have these conversions showing up inside Google so that you can overtime optimize a lot easier and eventually your campaigns will run on their own.

Next, I want to talk about bid strategy.

As you can see here, in every campaign, when you're setting it up, you can set a bid strategy.

A lot of times Google recommend that you start out with a maximize conversions or a target CPA.

But if you're just starting out and you don't have any data inside your account, it's really hard to just tell Google a target CPA because they don't have any data on what is actually happening for that conversion that you've set up and they don't know how much it's going to cost.

So if you start with a target CPA bid, then what's going to happen is you're just going to get a whole bunch of traffic and a lot of it is going to be expensive and you're not really going to have any data.

So one of the strategies I've been using that seems to be working quite well as I start with the manual cost per click.

So when you're doing your bidding, you set a manual cost per click.

And you can see there's other strategies here.

You can maximize clicks, which also is pretty good, I must say, when you're starting out and you'll see that Google does not recommend this.

They want people to use the automated bidding.

But like I said, when you're first starting a campaign, you're going to probably want to start with a manual cost per click or a maximized clicks so you can get traffic.

And hopefully some of those people will start converting.

And then over time, you're going to get conversions into Google, at which point then you can switch to a more strategic bidding strategy like maximize conversions with a target CPA.

You can see here you can set.

So if you're getting paid, say \$35 from your network or your affiliate program and you want to make a profit, you can set a target CPA here, maybe \$25 or \$30, whatever it is.

And you can overtime, you'll see Google does in fact do quite well at getting your target CPA to where it should be as long as you're giving it the data it needs and you have a good user experience on your landing page.

So there's certain things you need to make sure you do first before you get to the stage.

But this is a very important one that you need to understand.

The last one I want to talk about is choosing the right affiliate offer.

Now you can see here, this is an old campaign from me.

I was actually running a Garcinia Cambogia back in the day.

And now for any of you Ogs out there who've been around for a long time, you probably know and have heard of Garcinia Cambogia.

And that was one of the fad diets probably 7 years ago.

As you can see, this was still running back in the day.

And nowadays if you were to run a campaign that is a highly, you know, fad diet, you'd probably get banned right out of the gates if you started a campaign and started running something like this.

So I want to be sure that you understand that when you see everybody making money from this crazy offer like Exit Pure or one of these ClickBank diet products or a skin care or, you know, anything related to trials, you need to be very careful that you pick an offer that is compliant with Google, especially if it's your first campaign on Google.

Google has a good way of knowing if you're just coming in to try and circumvent their systems or use affiliate links and landing pages.

They have a really good way of just automatically banning you.

So you need to be careful and warm up your account, we'll say, and give them good quality ads, good quality landing pages and good offers.

So don't start with a trial offer or something that's fad diets or anything like that come in and maybe start with your own squeeze page where you collect an e-mail and you send them information afterwards to sell them these, you know, high risk products that you might find on CPA affiliate networks.
